## REGULATION No. 240 PROGRAM

## **CARDIOPULMONARY RESUSCITATION PLAN**

This regulation is designed to assist District employees in understanding expectations regarding required training in Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) per NRS 391.092. The District's plan is intended to accomplish the following:

- 1. Provide guidance for teachers and other licensed educational personnel in the school District who teach or supervise students in physical education.
- 2. Define school courses and activities which involve risk that may require cardiopulmonary resuscitation to be administered. While Nevada Revised Statue 391.092 requires districts to develop a CPR plan and to train employees in cardiopulmonary resuscitation, each employee retains the right to determine whether he or she is willing to use the training on others in distress.
- Comply with the guidelines established by the American National Red Cross, and the American Heart Association for the certification of persons in the administration of CPR. Training in CPR will occur at least two times per year. Certification is valid for two years.

District employees required to be trained in CPR include:

- 1. K-12 Health and Physical Education, certified and classified staff
- 2. 9-12 high school laboratory science teachers
- 3. K-12 special education teachers in Comprehensive Life Skills classrooms
- K- 12 special education certified and classified staff that have at-risk students per their IEP; any special education staff member as determined by the Student Support Services Director
- 5. 6-12 career and technical teachers in welding, health occupations, manufacturing
- 6. K-12 competitive sports coaches
- 7. K-12 classified staff who transport students
- 8. School Nurses (BSN, RN), RNs LPNs Clinical Aides
- 9. K-12 Site Emergency Response Teams

Training Responsibilities

1. The Transportation Supervisor will coordinate training dates within the Transportation Department for bus drivers.

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- 2. The Risk Manager will coordinate training dates for all other classified and certified employees.
- 3. The Human Resources Department will notify the Risk Manager of new hires who are in the required categories to be trained in CPR.
- 4. High school Athletic Director, and middle school designated athletic directors will notify the Risk Manager of new coaches needing CPR training.
